

Directions to weds nov 5th 2003 730pm
Loren Mosher talk at Mount Holyoke College:

Five College Bus: There is a 5-college bus stop on Park Street (at the Reese Psychology & Education Building--it's the first bus stop at Mount Holyoke). When you get off the bus, walk a bit further down Park Street. Once you cross a small bridge, the Willits-Hallowell Center is on your right. The Morrison Room is downstairs.

Driving from Northampton: Take route 47 to South Hadley. When you reach the center of South Hadley, go straight, keeping the town green on your right (don't take the right fork at the Village Commons); the post office will be on your left. At the stop sign, you will again go straight, crossing route 116. The street you enter will be Park Street. Once on Park Street, continue down the hill, go over a small bridge and Willits-Hallowell will be on your right.

From Amherst: Take route 116 south to South Hadley. Just as you get to the center of South Hadley (at the town common and Village Commons shops), take a left onto Park Street. Park Street is just before the Congregational Church. Once on Park Street, continue down the hill, go over a small bridge and Willits-Hallowell will be on your right.

From Holyoke: Take route 116 north to South Hadley. As you get to the center of South Hadley (at the town common and Village Commons shops), turn right on Church Street. Church Street is just before the Congregational Church. Once past the church, the street name changes to Park Street. On Park Street continue down the hill, go over a small bridge and Willits-Hallowell will be on your right.

Parking and Handicap Accessibility: In the evening you can park in any faculty/staff parking space. There is also guest parking in front of Willits-Hallowell (follow directions above), and behind Willits-Hallowell (turn right just BEFORE the small bridge, pass the Art Museum on your right, and then turn left crossing another small bridge, to enter the parking lot). Because the lecture is being held on the lower level of Willits, the best handicap entrance is at the BACK of the building. There are handicap parking spots in that lot.
